Dear Mr. Oliver:

This is in further response to your letter, dated January 2, 2016, and your follow-up letters, appealing the determination of the Records Access Officer (RAO), dated December 3, 2015, regarding your request, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Law ("FOIL"), for certain records related to Long Range Acoustical Devices (LRADS).

Your appeal is granted only to the extent that enclosed are 25 pages of records. These 25 pages are in addition to the four Patrol Guide provisions – 203-11, 213-05, 213-11, and 213-15, which were disclosed by the RAO with his December 3, 2015 determination.


However, the appeal is denied with regard to other located records pursuant to Public Officers Law Section 87(2)(e)(iv) because disclosure of the requested records would reveal non-routine criminal investigative techniques or procedures.

In addition, the appeal is further denied pursuant to POL Section 87(2)(e)(i), in that the requested records, if disclosed, would interfere with ongoing judicial proceedings, including *Anika Edrei et al. v City of New York*, Index Number 16CV01652, in United States District Court.

Other exemptions under FOIL also may apply.

You may seek judicial review of this determination by commencing an Article 78 proceeding within four months of the date of this decision.
